HSEM URGES PRECAUTIONS AS SEASON’S FIRST STORM APPROACHES

CONCORD, N.H. – The winter season’s first significant storm is expected to dump 6-10 inches of snow on most of New Hampshire, with more in the north, and the state Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management is encouraging residents to take steps to stay safe.

The storm, which is expected to move into the state early Wednesday morning, will create dangerous conditions on the state's highway.

"Winter storms are a fact of life in New Hampshire," said Christopher M. Pope, director of Homeland Security and Emergency Management. "As long as we take appropriate precautions, we can enjoy the winter weather safely."

Pope reminded motorists to slow down and allow extra space between vehicles. He also cautioned against following plow trucks too closely.

"This is also a good time to remind people about basic winter weather precautions," Pope said.

- Pay attention to storm watches and warnings from the National Weather Service on Weather Service Radio or radio or television news broadcasts.
- Keep emergency supplies at home, including extra food and water, flashlights and fresh batteries and a battery-powered radio.
- If possible, stay home and off the roads until highway crews have a chance to plow.
- Test emergency generators and operate generators according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Be careful of over-exertion when shoveling snow.
- Operate snow blowers safely. Never put hands near moving machine parts.

In the event of a power outage, report the outage to your electric utility. Never use candles for emergency lighting because of the fire hazard and never use outdoor heating appliances indoors because of the danger of carbon monoxide.

The Greater Franklin/Bristol All Health Hazards Region is offering a Phase III H1N1 Clinic on Saturday, December 12th for the residents of Alexandria, Andover, Bridgewater, Bristol, Danbury, Franklin, Groton, Hebron, Hill, New Hampton, Northfield, Salisbury, Sanbornton and Tilton.

THIS FREE CLINIC IS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY for people in the following groups:

- **Anyone between the ages of 6 months and 24 years**
- **Adults 25 through 64 years of age with underlying medical conditions**

THE FOLLOWING GROUPS remain eligible to receive their vaccine through their healthcare provider or at the appointment only clinics:

- **Healthcare workers and first responders with direct patient contact**
- **Pregnant women**
- **People caring for or living with infants younger than 6 months (including partners of pregnant women)**

ALERT – FRAUDULENT EMAILS

CDC has received reports of fraudulent emails (phishing) referencing a CDC sponsored State Vaccination Program.

The messages request that users must create a personal H1N1 (swine flu) Vaccination Profile on the cdc.gov website. The message then states that anyone that has reached the age of 18 has to have his/her personal Vaccination Profile on the cdc.gov site.

CDC has NOT implemented a state vaccination program requiring registration on ww.cdc.gov. Users that click on the e-mail are at risk of having malicious code installed on their system. CDC reminds users to take the following steps to reduce the risk of being a victim of a phishing attack:

- *Do not follow unsolicited links and do not open or respond to unsolicited email messages.
- *Use caution when visiting un-trusted websites.
- *Use caution when entering personal information online.

Subject: State Vaccination Program

You have received this e-mail because of the launching of State Vaccination H1N1 Program.

You need to create your personal H1N1 (swine flu) Vaccination Profile on the cdc.gov website. The Vaccination is not obligatory, but every person that has reached the age of 18 has to have his personal Vaccination Profile on the cdc.gov site. This profile has to be created both for the vaccinated people and the not-vaccinated ones. This profile is used for the registering system of vaccinated and not-vaccinated people. New Hampton School to Offer Free Learn to Skate Programs For Kids in Grades K-6 and Free Skate For All Ages
