THE NEW HAMPTON SCHOOL

Norma Jean “Jinga” (Smith) Moore will present a program on the early history of the Town of New Hampton, its public graded schools and the

New Hampton School, formally known as the Academic and Theological Institution founded in 1821 built by the Kelley and Simpson families and other prominent citizens of the town. At that time in New Hampshire public schools, which were one room school houses, provided only 1-6 graded education. These early settlers valued higher education and proceeded to build the private school named The Academy at New Hampton. In 1826, the Baptist denomination assumed sponsorship of the school and changed its name to New Hampton Academical and Theological Institution.

In 1926 at the age of 2 Ms. Moore came to the school with her father, Fredrick Smith, when he assumed the Headmaster's position. She later taught Spanish and Latin at the school and married Bud Moore, Headmaster from 1959-1993. Using slides and her unique understanding of the history of the village and the school, Ms Moore will provide an entertaining and thoughtful presentation that anyone living in the area will thoroughly enjoy.

TOWN CLERK/TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

- 1. Dog Licenses for 2010 can be purchased at the Town Offices. Bring the rabies certificate or call to find out if it needs to be updated.**
- 2. Transfer Station Permits (dump stickers) for 2010: Available by mail or in person. You may order a 2010 Transfer Station Permit ("Dump Sticker") by Mail. There is no charge for the Permit. Please follow these steps: 1. Send COPY of Registration for each vehicle that needs a Permit with your New Hampton address if not on registration. 2. Enclose a Self-Addressed, Stamped Envelope for the return of your Permit(s).**

NOTE: You must be a resident, business owner, or non-resident property owner of the Town of New Hampton, and your use of the Transfer Station is for acceptable solid wastes generated in New Hampton.

Your request for a Permit may be included with other business by mail, such as payment of tax bills, registration of motor vehicles, and renewal of dog licenses.
