The Town of New Hampton is soliciting proposals for the following streambank stabilization project located within the Town of New Hampton, 84 West Shore Road, Tax Map U-14, Lot 5, owned by Christopher and Debra Madden:

Description: The Town of New Hampton is sponsoring this EWP Recovery Project on behalf of the property owners. The significant storm events of August 2008 carved out a large swath of the property, exposed water, gas and electric lines, obliterated the access to the house and caused a large outfall of sediment into Lake Winona. This lot is 0.24 acres and has approximately 70 feet of shoreline frontage on Lake Winona.

**PROJECT #2** Town of New Hampton Request for Proposal (RFP) # 2009-112

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE IMPLEMENTS INCREASE IN MOTOR VEHICLE FEES

**EFFECTIVE 8/1/09:**

- The fee for a certified copy of a registration has increased from \$10 to \$15
- The vanity plate service fee has increased from \$25 to 40 per year for a renewal or twelve (12) month new registration
- **Vehicle Registrations:**
  - 0-3000lbs – A \$30 (\$2.50/month) surcharge shall also be charged, making the total State fee \$61.20 for twelve months.
  - 3001-5000lbs - A \$30 (\$2.50/month) surcharge shall also be charged, making the total State fee \$73.20 for twelve months.
  - 5001-8000lbs - A \$45 (\$3.75/month) surcharge shall also be charged, making the total State fee \$100.20 for twelve months.
  - 8001-10000lbs A \$45 (\$3.75/month) surcharge shall also be charged, making the total State fee \$ .96 per hundred pounds gross weight, plus \$45.
  - 10001-26000lbs A \$55 (\$4.58/month) surcharge shall also be charged, making the total State fee \$ .96 per hundred pounds gross weight, plus \$55.
  - 26001-73280lbs A \$75 (6.25/month) surcharge shall also be charged, making the total State fee \$.96 per hundred pounds gross weight plus \$75.
- **Semi-Trailers & Auto Utility Trailer Registrations:**
  - 0-3000lbs has increased \$5.00 (flat fees based on weight \$8, \$11, \$17)
  - 3001-8000lbs has increased \$10.00(flat fees based on weight \$34 or \$46)
  - 8001lbs & greater has increased from \$.60 per hundred lbs gross weight to \$.90 per hundred lbs gross weight
- **Motorcycle Registrations:**
  - The fee has increase \$10.00 (from \$16 to \$26)

**EFFECTIVE AUGUST 28, 2009**

- **Boat Registrations:**

- Up to and including 16 feet has increase from \$12 to \$24
- 16.1 feet to 21 feet has increased from \$17 to \$34
- 21.1 feet to 30 feet has increased from \$26 to \$52
- 30.1 feet to 45 feet has increased from \$36 to \$72
- 45.1 feet and over has increased from \$46 to \$92
- The lake restoration and preservation fee has increased from \$5 to \$7.50
- The boat agent fee has increased from \$1.50 to \$5
- The minimum fee to transfer a boat registration has increase from \$3 to \$5
